MORE INFORMATION ABOUT RECHARTER

Start doing the preparation work by making sure all your unit volunteers have Youth Protection Training (YPT) that will be valid for the entire charter period (Calendar Year 2023). Also follow up with those leaders who haven't completed AB 506 training. Citizenship in Society Merit Badge NOW Eagle Required

Scoutmasters: Thank you for helping your Scouts in their journey through Scouting. The new merit badge, Citizenship in Society, is now "Eagle Required." The Advancement Committee has adopted a process focused on serving those youth who will "age out" this calendar year. Both Scouts and Counselors participating in National's pilot reported that results were enhanced working with a group of 6 to 8 high school aged Scouts who were within 2 years of age.

The process prioritizes 17-year-old Life Scouts who will not complete the Eagle Scout requirements (less an Eagle Board of Review) prior to June 30, 2022. Participation will be expanded for other Life Scouts (and other ranks) as the demand by 17-year-olds diminishes.

Please:

Review the Citizenship in Society requirements. Review the Scout's record of completed merit badges. Discuss cohort participation with Scout and parent. Determine readiness. Complete the on-line form: <u>https://forms.gle/rxgjH2zU8b8aofyf8</u> Please assure the parent is connected to Scout in Scoutbook as all communication and Merit Badge sign-offs will occur through Scoutbook

What will happen:

Parent will be sent coupon code and instructions for Scout to: Review Available Citizenship in Society Cohorts Select Cohort with compatible schedule Register using a one-time Coupon Code or pay \$1,000 (this is there to ensure scout has a coupon code!). Scoutbook will be used for all communications. Virtual meetings such as Zoom, Goggle Teams, etc.

Opportunity for Civic Engagement: Light up the Season Returns to City of Hayward December 3

Light Up the Season, the annual downtown Hayward winter-time celebration and lighting ceremony, is returning to the City Hall rotunda and plaza the afternoon and evening of Saturday, Dec. 3, and local organizations, businesses, associations and school groups are welcome to participate.

After two-years of virtual and scaled-back Light Up the Season programs due to COVID-19, the City of Hayward is reintroducing the event with the goal of creating a time and place for Hayward residents to come together in a spirit of inclusion, and to share and celebrate winter-time traditions of our diverse communities. How do you celebrate Twin Luminaries, Mawlid al-Nabi, Chalica, Bodhi Day, Las Posadas, Hanukkah, Winter Solstice, Christmas, Kwanzaa, Lohri, Pongal, or other occasions that have the common theme of remembering that there is light even during the season of long nights?

With the 2022 edition of Light Up the Season, the City seeks to partner with community organizations, local businesses and associations, and school groups to recognize and to honor the sense of pride, togetherness and belonging shared by Hayward residents and interrupted by the pandemic. We invite you to present music and dance from these various winter traditions and to decorate homes and businesses in ways that recognize and embrace our commonalities as well as our wealth of cultures and traditions.

During the event, the City will continue its tradition of holding a lighting of a tree and other decorations just after sundown at approximately 5 p.m., as well as displays of fire engines and other apparatus, police officer- and firefighter-led seasonal toy and donation drives, an appearance by Curbie, the Hayward Public Library bookmobile, and other offerings.
